Dáil Question No: 236

To ask the Minister for Transport the number of parking spaces in each public car-park area within Dublin Airport, in tabular form.

Dear Deputy Donnelly,

Thank you for your query.

In total, Dublin Airport has approximately 23,000 car parking spaces. For short term car parking, we have more than 3,800 spaces (c. 2,100 in Terminal 1 and c. 1,700 in Terminal 2). For long term car parking, we have more than 19,000 spaces which includes c. 7,600 in express red, c. 8,800 in holiday blue and c. 2,700 in the green car park.

Car parking numbers at Dublin Airport can vary day to day due to a variety of reasons, including maintenance schedules, customer behaviours, weather conditions and operational constraints etc.

You may also be interested to note that, currently, around one third (33%) of departing passengers and one third (35%) of the 19,900 people working at Dublin Airport travel to the campus by bus and Dublin Airport sees strong potential to increase both percentages over the coming years. Following a successful tender process for the allocation of bus stops at Dublin Airport, daa has secured commitments from operators that they will deliver a seat for every passenger from 2024 onwards, with more than 35 million bus seats expected to be available by 2025. Operators have also committed to increase capacity further in subsequent years if demand requires. The improvements will kick in from March this year, with more than 1,000 buses per day set to depart from Dublin Airport in 2024 (up from around 900 last year), rising to 1,200 per day in 2025, subject to operator rollout.
