

daa's Healthy Local Environment Policy provides a foundation for a more sustainable future for our group activities, with a focus on Air Quality, Surface Water Quality, Water Consumption, Noise and Biodiversity. daa is committed to minimising the impact of our activities on the environment and local ecosystems. We will do this by improving air quality, reducing our water consumption and impact, aligning with best practice in noise management and supporting nature to flourish, considering the footprint and operations of our business. We understand that the delivery of impactful initiatives, compliance with regulation and ongoing engagement with our operators and regulators, are key to achieving a more sustainable future and a healthy local environment.

## Scope of Policy

To do this, we will;

- Review objectives, targets and performance related to Air, Water and Biodiversity, on at least an annual basis;
- Comply with all relevant regulatory requirements related to Air, Water, Noise and Biodiversity;
- Continuously seek to improve our practices in relation to air quality, water, noise and biodiversity management;
- Continuously monitor the air and water quality at our aerodromes and report on the outcomes with relevant stakeholders;
- Ensure that all pollution and contamination incidents are reported and addressed in an efficient and timely manner to reduce their impact on the business and local environments;
- Transition our infrastructure and operations away from fossil fuels in order to improve local air quality;
- Design for proper and efficient water management in infrastructure and refurbishment projects, minimising the impact on water resources and including for the reuse of water where possible;
- Consider biodiversity and air and water quality impacts and improvement are factored into infrastructure and refurbishment projects;
- Develop campus level biodiversity action plans to compensate for the operational impact of our activities and support nature to flourish at our sites;
- Provide training and guidance for management, staff, operators and stakeholders on the critical issues related to air, water, noise and biodiversity;
- Collaborate with internal and external stakeholders, across supply chain, to reduce to improve air and water quality, water use, noise and environmental impact;
- Ensure organisational compliance with the Airport Environmental Direction, and the programme of Environmental Audits;
- Provide the necessary resources to achieve our energy objectives and targets.

By implementing this approach, our operations will not only improve quality but reduce water consumption and ensure a considered approach to preserving and increasing biodiversity at our sites. All daa colleagues, as well as on-site Contractors/Suppliers working on our behalf have a role to play in conserving energy. We are all responsible to efficiently use energy which is under their direct control.

All daa business units are responsible for compliance with this policy as appropriate to their business operations.

This policy is shared with our colleagues within the organisation and is available to the public and other interested parties on our website. The policy is reviewed annually and updated as necessary.
